



Q. Why do horses get ulcers?

A. Nature intended horses to graze almost constantly, keeping food in the stomach at all times. Today, we tend to feed 2-3 large grain-based meals a day and less roughage than the horse would naturally eat. During the long periods between feedings, potent stomach acids have nothing to digest. As a result, these acids irritate the stomach lining causing EGUS (Equine Gastric Ulcer Syndrome).

Many experts estimate that up to 80% of horses suffer from regular and severe bouts of gastric distress.
